Enclosed you will find an application for a Right Of Way (ROW) **Title V** action for the proposed Washington Parkway north of St. George. The application includes all the necessary paperwork and preliminary engineering drawings to begin the necessary NEPA analysis on the project. The Commission would like to begin this separate process knowing that eventually you can incorporate this project analysis in your Resource Management Plan (RMP) process down the road.

The Washington County Commission has looked at how long other BLM Resource Management Plan (RMP) projects have taken in the state of Utah and how long it has taken the BLM to get to the alternative phase of your current plan and is not comfortable waiting for the Resource Management Plan (RMP) to be completed. We also understand the current Resource Management Plan (RMP) could end up in appeals and litigation like other plans in Utah, thus delaying the future of any site specific analysis for this Right Of Way (ROW) action.

We understand this separate **Title V** Right of Way (ROW) NEPA action on the Washington Parkway, once completed, can amend your current Land Use Plan and eventually be incorporated into your ongoing Resource Management Planning effort. With the anticipated growth in Washington County and knowing that funding will be available within the next 24 to 36 months to construct this road, we as a Commission feel it is ripe to move forward with this project. This project is a high priority for Washington County as it relates to future growth and safety issues to our citizens.

We would like to begin the NEPA analysis as soon as possible. We understand there are many issues within the project area particularly where the proposed Right Of Way (ROW) will go through the recently designated Red Cliffs National Conservation Area which has listed Mojave Desert Tortoise habitat. Knowing this, we anticipate a full Environmental Impact Statement may be necessary on the project and are willing to cooperate and coordinate with Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) in providing funding for the NEPA analysis.

We would like your staff, or whoever you deem to be the BLM project leader, to coordinate with Ron Whitehead who is our Public Works Director for Washington County. We would like to have this NEPA Analysis completed and a Right Of Way (ROW) Title V action granted to Washington County by June 30, 2014. This should be ample time to complete the analysis and grant the Title V.

Washington County along with Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) will work together to produce environmental analysis studies, construction drawings, financing, and construction oversight to ensure this facility is built to Local, State, and Federal requirements. Washington County and UDOT will partner on this project similar to the way the Southern Parkway is being constructed. Washington County and UDOT have sufficient funding mechanisms in place to acquire the technical and logistical resources to successfully plan, design, construct, and maintain this transportation artery.

13a. Describe other reasonable alternative routes and modes considered.

Washington County has concluded this proposal to construct an east-west major arterial highway corridor is the most feasible for traffic movement now and in the future. It appears to be the shortest route and most economically feasible at this time. There may be other alternatives that may be analyzed in the Environmental document, including the no-action alternative, but the County feels this proposal best meets the Counties' needs for transportation and mitigation requirements for the NCA.

17. Describe likely environmental effects that the proposed project will have on: (a) air quality; (b) visual impact; (c) surface and ground water quality and quantity; (d) the control or structural change on any stream or other body of water; (e) existing noise levels; and (f) the surface of the land, including vegetation, permafrost, soil, and soil stability.

Air quality will be improved by shorter travel times with less stop and go traffic. The visual impacts will be limited due to the undulating and broken terrain this road will be located in. Surface disturbance will be mitigated through restoration and revegetation wherever possible. Surface water and groundwater quality will not be adversely affected, as any disturbances will be mitigated so there are no problems with surface water quality and storm water pollution. Water quantity will not be affected through this project. Existing noise levels will increase near the new road but will be limited as to distance the noise will travel by the varied terrain. The surface of the land will be restored to minimize any soil stabilization problems that do not currently exist. We anticipate mitigation work within the NCA that will enhance the conditions in the NCA.

Purpose and Need for the Facility:

Washington County is applying for the Washington Parkway Road right-of-way to provide long term traffic congestion relief to I-15, St. George Boulevard, and Bluff Street in the St. George area. This east-west transportation corridor north of St. George will relieve the increasing traffic congestion in the St. George area.

Facility Location:

The proposed right-of-way location is described as follows: See attached maps

Facility Design Factors:

This east-west corridor is approximately 6.4 miles with 1.56 miles lying within Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and National Conservation Area (NCA) boundaries. An additional 2.06 miles is on City and private properties within the Red Cliffs Desert (Reserve). We understand that a separate NEPA analysis will need to be conducted with this request for a Title V right-of-way. We realize there are many issues within the project area that will need to be addressed and we are willing to cooperate and coordinate with Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) to help facilitate the analysis.

The road surface would be paved four (4) lanes wide with turn lanes, and built to current design standards with additional improvements to facilitate animal movement within the NCA and Reserve areas. We will also work to mitigate and enhance the Reserve for any impacts associated with this project.

Resource Values and Concerns:

Working inside the Reserve and NCA will be addressed in the construction drawings, making certain the threatened and endangered species are all protected during construction. Some wildlife may be displaced by construction, but could be removed and held at an approved site until completion of the
